It takes up to 60 minks to make a fur coat. Fur farmers use gassing, anal electrocution and poisoning to kill them. Because minks have a heightened ability to detect lack of oxygen, they can linger for fifteen minutes and experience severe convulsions, pain and stress.

REVENGE OF THE MINKS

A bipartisan <u>proposal</u> in the U.S. House would ban mink farming in the U.S., as well as the sale, purchase, transport, import or export of mink fur. The bill was introduced this month by Rep. Rosa DeLauro (D-Conn) and Rep. Nancy Mace (R- S.C.) in an effort to stem possible mutations of COVID-19.

According to the European Center for Disease Prevention & Control, "When the virus is introduced into a mink farm, it can spread quickly, leading to many cases among mink.... the virus can accumulate mutations. Such variants have the possibility to spread back into the human population."

There have been several mink-related coronavirus cases in the United States. A number of people working on a Michigan mink farm were infected with a coronavirus that had mink-related mutations last December.

PACIFIC NW HEAT DOME NOT POSSIBLE WITHOUT CLIMATE CHANGE

The Pacific Northwest "heat dome" that broke temperature records this month and killed hundreds of people from southern Oregon to Canada was "virtually impossible without human caused climate change," according to scientists at World Weather Attribution.

Portland hit an unprecedented 116 degrees; Seattle 108 degrees. Power lines melted, roads buckled and sea creatures succumbed by the millions. In Lytton, Canada the temperature reached 121 degrees breaking its record by a full eight degrees for three days in a row. Fire consumed the village the next day.

More than 800 deaths in the Pacific Northwest are being investigated as heat-related and health officials expect that number to go up. Should the earth warm another 1.4 degrees, this one-in-a-thousand-year phenomenon would happen every five to ten years. "When we have an extreme weather event of this magnitude in the future...it's going to be that much worse because of the continued background warming," said Nicholas Bond, Washington's state climatologist. - Alicia Caldwell, Wall Street Journal July 12, 2021.

The World Weather Attribution study concludes: "Our results provide a strong warning: our rapidly warming climate is bringing us into uncharted territory that has significant consequences for health, well-being, and livelihoods. *Adaptation and mitigation are urgently needed to prepare societies for a very different future."* [Emphasis added]
