"GROW UP" AND PROTECT THIS PRECIOUS BLUE SPHERE

At the United Nations this month, British Prime Minister Boris Johnson's frustration with the slow pace of response to climate change was apparent, telling his fellow world leaders to "grow up" and tackle climate change.

Twitter dubbed this the Best Boris Johnson line in some time: "*The world – this precious blue sphere with its eggshell crust and wisp of an atmosphere – is not some indestructible toy, some bouncy plastic romper room against which we can hurl ourselves to our heart's content.*"

"If we keep on the current track ", he continued, "... We will see desertification, drought, crop failure, and mass movements of humanity on a scale not seen before. Not because of some unforeseen natural event or disaster, but because of us, because of what we are doing now."

While there is some hope for spurring meaningful change in the Biden "infrastructure" bill, not nearly enough is directed toward climate versus "human infrastructure". Every senator and representative – Democrat and Republican - in the nation needs to hear from you that action directed *truly*

Some of the bill's provisions, such as subsidizing logging companies to take down even more of earth's life-giving carbonsequestering large trees, will actually exacerbate <u>climate change</u>. "Details" like this must not get lost in the frantic race to placate all lobbyists and pass just anything that will move money into the hands of everyone - including the historically destructive industries like logging, mining and fuel extraction.

FOOD FEATURE: MEAL KITS FOR KIDS TO MAKE FOR SCHOOL



Fall's abundant harvest comes just in time for kids to dig in and get creative with meal kits they will have fun making and even more fun eating for school lunch or after-school snacking. Plus, getting kids in the kitchen with you is a great way to help them start developing healthy eating habits.

These kits include whole grains, plenty of healthy proteins, easy-to-eat veggies and of course, something naturally sweet.

Start with a divided portable bento-type lunch box or reusable leak-proof Tupperware and get creative. Here are few ideas:

- Protein Pump: Hard-boiled egg; almond butter on ½ whole-wheat bagel; apple slices with Cheddar cheese chunks
- Sophisticate: Lentil salad; avocado pre-sliced in half and reassembled; toast wedges; fresh berries (still in season in September!)
- Asian Treat: Jasmine rice; sauteed tofu slices; carrot salad; mango chunks or tangerine
- Pizza box: Toasted pita wedges; mozzarella sticks; tomato dipping sauce; lightly sauteed pizza veggies

Do it! This gives you a big voice in a very small pool of constituents who contact their representatives.
